Fr Nicholas opened in prayer.

<u>First Holy Communion</u> – Barbara reported all going well. The children liked the Advent booklets provided by the parish. Last lessons 12th and 19th December and then a break until 9th January. Continuing thanks to Hilary Wrack for her assistance.

Pope Francis – Synodal Church – Sr Dympna and Liz Duggan reported back. Not much response had been received to the forms handed out. Liz drew our attention to the website as given on the newsletter. The next step will be that each parishioner on the mailing list will receive an e-mail inviting them to join a discussion group. Sister Dympna invited us to pray for the Synodal Church process – copies of prayers are at the back of church. A Synod newsletter is planned. Barbara was asked to include this topic in the weekly Bidding Prayers.

Trish reported that the curtain needs to be changed for Christmas, probably on Christmas Eve.

Altar Linen

Teresa Williams explained the special way in which washing and ironing the altar linen needs to be done. She reported that she is now the only person doing this job and although she is happy to do it, she would be grateful for volunteers to assist her.

Offertory

Before the pandemic, the family who had requested the Mass were invited to bring up the bread and wine. Teresa had been organising this. This had stopped during the pandemic, but Fr Nicholas feels it is the right time to restart this. Sometimes Masses are requested very shortly before the actual day and thus the families miss out on this opportunity. Barbara also needs to know the names by the time the Bidding Prayers are sent to the readers. Teresa will look into this.

Collection

It has been noted that the offertory collection remains well down on pre-pandemic levels. Baskets left by the door do not generate as much giving, so Martin Kay and Trisha Baxter will between them create collection bags on poles to try to encourage more giving. It was hoped to have these in use by Christmas.

Rachel Kirkham drew our attention to the major famine in East Africa and said that a special appeal was likely. We could consider holding a second collection for this. Barbara will include this intention in the Bidding Prayers.
