Minutes of the Inaugural Meeting of the Parish Liturgy Committee

Eucharistic Ministers: Teresa W queried whether the Childrens Liturgy might be re-started – an organised session for young children based on the gospel story held in another room, and the children process into church at the Offertory procession with their pictures etc. DBS checks would be needed, and training. Jon queried that the use of the Chalice at Mass will be permitted after Easter, but Father N says that it's not the right time yet. Jon prepares the Rota for the Eucharistic Ministers who assist the priest at Communion time. Teresa L queried whether the Eucharistic Minister should give a child a blessing when they come up with parents – it was agreed that an announcement will be made at the beginning of Mass to say, "if you wish your child to be blessed at Holy Communion time, please go to the priest." This will also be put in the newsletter.

Readers Ministry: there are 2 different systems for the two Masses, the 6pm Saturday, and the 11am Sunday. Rotas to be sent to Jon, by Lynn for the 6 pm Mass, and by Nigel for the 11 am. Discussion followed on the formal carrying of the Gospel Book in procession at the beginning of Mass – no conclusion was reached. Discussion followed on the Response to the Psalm: can the Reader say "the Response to the Psalm is …", and it was agreed that this is appropriate. However Father said it would be good to have the words of the Response in the weekly newsletter.

LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS TO BE PLANNED

PALM SUNDAY it was decided to meet under the willow tree by the statue of our Lady and the infant Jesus before Mass on Palm Sunday, and process around the lawn and into the church, singing all the while "Ride on Ride on in Majesty"

HOLY WEEK TRIDUUM Nigel will have the Readers Rota ready for all the Easter services. Lynn suggested that Narrators have a copy of the Gospel the week before the Service. Nigel suggested offering to take the parish coach to the Cathedral for the Maundy Thursday Mass in the morning, he will try to get this in the newsletter if possible.

Spy Wednesday from 4 till 6 pm the cleaning and arranging party will be busy. Nigel with Liz and her boys will remove Latin Mass kneelers out of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, in readiness for the Altar of Repose on Holy Thursday night. Also there are wheel chairs there which might be useful if available.

Maundy Thursday — 7 pm is the new time for the Mass. The re-dedication of Ministers of the Eucharist and of the Word will take place during the Maundy Thursday Mass. Also people will be invited to have their feet washed during the Mass — needing the bowl and the towels to be ready.

Good Friday - service at 3 pm. there will be the Veneration of the Cross during the service, but people are asked to bow to the cross and to kiss the cross on their own rosary. Two Eucharistic Ministers will be needed. People leave the church in Solemn Silence.

Holy Saturday - times of Masses will be 5 pm for families, and 7 pm for socially distanced, and the Vigil Service at 10pm. Pascal Fire will be lit by John Duah, and candles available for the people. There will be blessing of the Holy Water. It is wonderful that there will be 1 person receiving Holy Communion and Confirmation, and 2 persons receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Vigil.

Easter Sunday - Mass at 11 am.
