# A Liturgical calendar for October and November 2024

October is month dedicated to the Rosary.

There will be a parish rosary group every Tuesday at 6pm before Mass at 6:30pm We invite as many people to join as possible.

On Tuesdays 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> October Father Richard is not available but we hope that Bishop David will permit a service of Communion and the Word.

We recognise that with work and family commitments it isn't always easy to come to such an event so we encourage all our parishioners to make the effort to say the Rosary at home. There are several websites with guidance, most are based in the US but our neighbouring diocese of East Anglia has one – Google "How to,,, pray the Rosary... Catholic Diocese of East Anglia" and follow the link.

We encourage people to take time before or after Mass to say a prayer to Our Blessed Lady before her statue.

There will be a twig tree (like the one we use at Christmas for the Giving Tree) so that people may attach their prayers – there will be paper and pens for people to write their prayers.

5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> October, the first weekend of the month is also the time of the CAFOD Collection for Family Fast Day and to remember the importance of the Earth as the provider of our food.

This year for the first time we will be able to take card payments as well as cash contributions.

November is the month of remembrance of the dead and there will be envelopes for people to include the names of people they would like remembered so that they can be included in the basket which will be placed in the sanctuary.

Sunday, 24<sup>th</sup> November is the last Sunday of the year and the Feast of Christ the King.

This is the parish feast day and we hope to mark it with a special Mass at 10.30am on Sunday morning and with a bring and share lunch afterwards.

This year the first Sunday of Advent marks several important events.

It is the first day on which the new lectionary is to be used.

It is also the beginning of the Holy Year to which Pope Francis has given the theme of Pilgrims of Hope and he has singled out both the way in which the world was striven by the pandemic and by the way in which we continue to be embroiled in war in so many countries.

Father Richard has asked that we should bless the parish territory by walking the boundaries section by section.
