LENT AT CHRIST THE KING

The sacrament of penance. We are all required to receive this sacrament and to receive Holy Communion at least once a year. Without doing so we can't continue receiving the Blessed Sacrament. The sacrament of penance is available on Friday and Saturday mornings, and it is hoped that this sacrament will also be available later in Lent on some Thursday evenings from a visiting priest.

Lent Holy Hours will be held on Wednesday evenings at 7pm with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and concluding with Benediction. These will be led Holy Hours on the theme of Christian hope, which is the motif of the Jubilee Year.

Stations of the Cross. We are all free to make the Stations at any time, but there will be led Stations of the Cross on the Fridays of Lent at 6pm. And weather permitting, these will take place outside in the parish precinct.

Days of Fasting and Abstinence. Both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of penance in the whole Church. We are called to eat less than we normally would and also not to eat meat (or, if we don't eat meat, to abstain from some other type of food) on these two days.

Pilgrimage of Hope for Creation ASH WEDNESDAY

"Today, let us not close our hearts, but listen to the voice of the Lord" Psalm 94

On this day of Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent, let's open up a little more to ecological conversion.

This time is given to us to prepare ourselves to make "a new heart and a new spirit" (Ezekiel 18:31) can be a good time to open our hearts to a love for our brothers and sisters, and for other creatures, that leads us to change our habits. This time can also help us to open our minds to a new understanding of the ongoing ecological crisis, and to a willingness to accept what it challenges in our beliefs and ways of doing things.

Forgiveness, fasting and almsgiving

These steps to which Christians are invited during Lent can be taken in the spirit of the conversion to which Pope Francis invites us in his encyclical Laudato Si.

- Through the act of forgiveness, we can recognize that we are not always playing the role of guardians of creation to which we are called, while welcoming the love of the God of mercy.
- The tradition of fasting can join the invitation to happy sobriety, enabling us to experience a new freedom in relation to certain goods or lifestyles on which we feel dependent.
- The tradition of almsgiving can help us to listen to the clamour of Earth and the clamour of the poor, and to empathize with the sufferings of people and creatures who are suffering.
